Americans were ecstatic with the news that he had been killed.

"I saw it on TV at home, I was like, 'it's about time,'" senior Bobby Ellis commented.

"Although I will say that Bin Laden is now the 2001-2011 Hide and Seek King," he added.

Many influential figures and celebrities have died in our lifetime and over the course of our four years of high school. 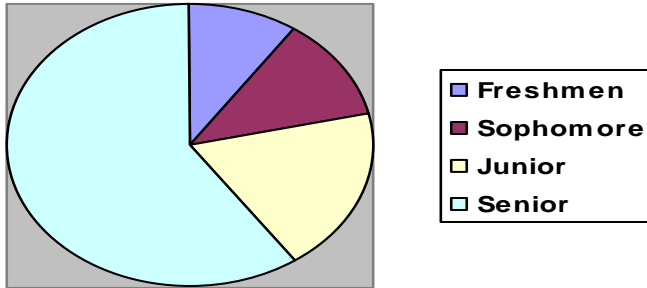
Sierra Hollopetter also explained her best and worst times.

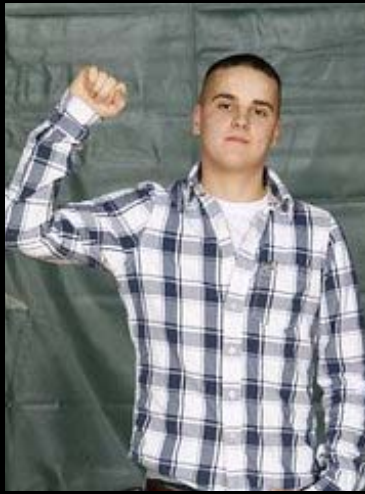

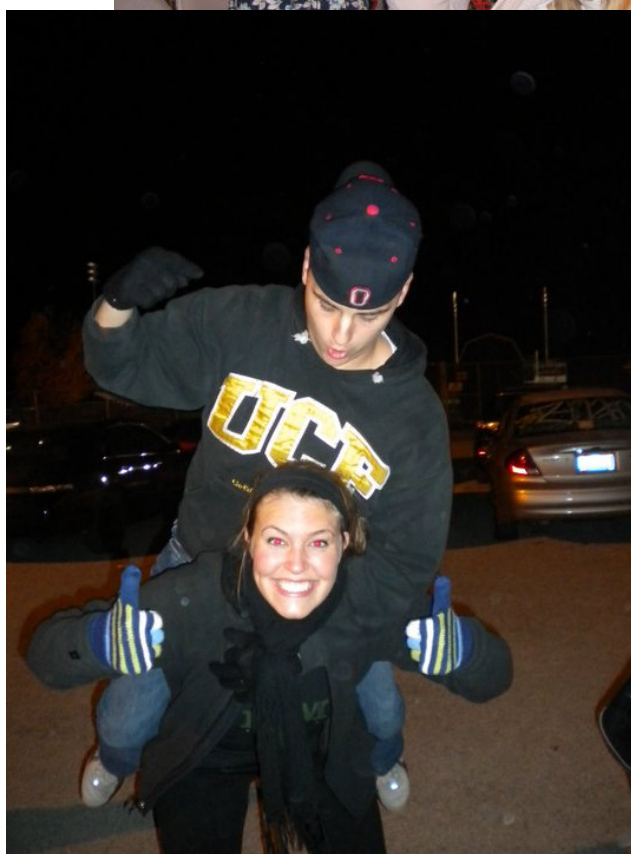

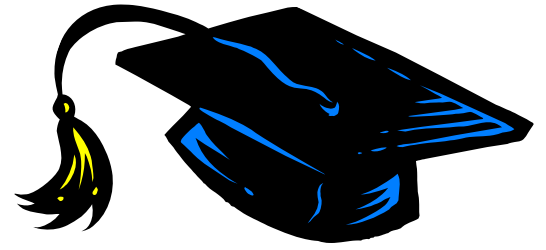
