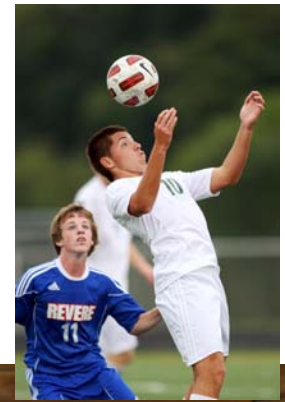

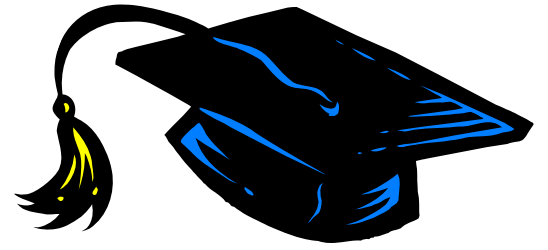

There will no longer be that excitement that always builds up right before Homecoming or Prom.

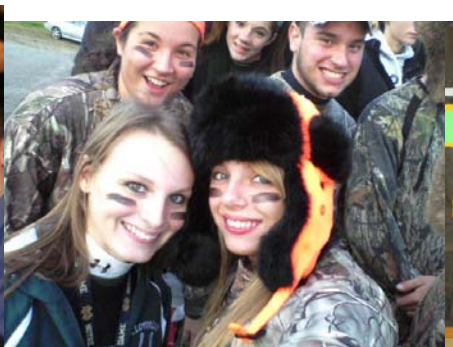
There will no longer be that sense of comfort knowing that there is a set routine for the school day.
